

# HURRICANE KIKO UPDATE NO. 1

Dear Valued Customer,

Young Brothers has been monitoring Hurricane Kiko as it continues toward the Hawaiian Islands and has modified our sailing schedule and cargo acceptance for the remainder of the week ahead of the arrival of the storm.

## Sailing Schedule Updates

Honolulu to Hilo sailing Saturday, September 6, 2025 – **RESCHEDULED** to Friday, September 5, 2025

- The barge is now scheduled to depart on Friday, September 5, 2025, and is estimated to arrive on Sunday, September 7, 2025. For customer convenience there will be special gate hours on Sunday, September 7, 2025 from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Cargo availability will be as follows, however, this is subject to change based on direction from the U.S. Coast Guard and State of Hawaii Department of Transportation – Harbors Division:
  - Dry and Refrigerated Straightload Containers – Upon discharge
  - Refrigerated loose and palletized cargo – Sunday, September 7, 2025 at 8:30 a.m.
  - Dry mixed and palletized cargo – Tuesday, September 9, 2025 at 7:30 a.m.

Hilo to Honolulu sailing Monday, September 8, 2025 – RESCHEDULED to Sunday, September 7, 2025

- The barge is now scheduled to depart on Sunday, September 7, 2025, and will sail out to safe harbor away from the storm. An updated arrival time will be provided in a future notice.
- Cargo acceptance will be limited to dry straightload containers, and dry mixed and palletized cargo only. **NO REFRIGERATED CARGO WILL BE ACCEPTED.**

Honolulu to Kaunakakai sailing Sunday, September 7, 2025 – NO CHANGES

Honolulu to Kawaihae, Nawiliwili, and Kahului sailing Monday, September 8, 2025 – NO CHANGES

## Cargo Acceptance Updates

In anticipation for severe ocean conditions including tropical storm force winds, Young Brothers will be modifying cargo acceptance at all ports. **No livestock, automobiles, roll-on roll-off cargo and hazardous material cargo (including in straightload containers) will be accepted except for medical/emergency supplies and public safety vehicles.**

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Young Brothers will continue to monitor the storm closely and anticipate that the Hurricane will produce severe ocean and wind conditions that will cause delays in sailings from Tuesday through Thursday of next week. The Company will provide updates on its operations at each port of call throughout Hawai'i as they may be affected by the storm.
