(which incorporates a requested return on equity of 10.70%) for the 2020 test year.

increase is to sustain Young Brothers' financial viability to ensure the provision of safe,
adequate, economical, and efficient service at reasonable rates in conformance with

the Hawaii Water Carrier Act” and is “based on the following main drivers: (1) increased rate base; (2) increased operating expenses; (3) continuing decline in intrastate cargo volume; and (4) an increase in the proposed cost of capital.”


At the public meeting, the Commission will receive in-person comments from the general public regarding the Application and the proposed rate increases and revised rate schedules and rules.


