Sailing Schedule Updates

Honolulu to Kaumalapau – **RECOVERY** sailing, Sunday, Sept. 13, 2026

- As part of our regularly scheduled sailing to Kaunakakai, YB will accommodate a recovery sailing to the port of Kaumalapau. The barge will depart on Sunday, Sept. 13, 2026, and arrive in Kaumalapau for the discharge of priority cargo.
- The port of Kaumalapau will have special gate hours on Monday, Sept. 14, 2026, from 7:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. for the drop off of cargo.
- The barge will continue to Kaunakakai for its regularly scheduled arrival on Monday, Sept. 14, 2026.
