

Rule No. 165 Shipper's Load and Count

As Hawai'i's foremost interisland freight handling company, it is our Ho'ohiki (commitment) to safely transport what matters most to Hawai'i. We do it quickly, reliably, safely, and securely. To help us ensure your cargo is correctly identified to be transported, please review these requirements when shipping with Young Brothers:

- Shipments moving as **Less than Container Load ("LCL")**:
 - Must be loaded, unitized, palletized, or skidded by shipper or its agent, with all bills of lading covering such shipment notated as "Shipper's Load and Count" (S/L/C).
 - YB will not be responsible for damage and/or shortage resulting from:
 - Shipper's or its agent's improper loading, unitizing, palletizing, skidding, or mixing articles; or
 - Failure of shipper or its agent to use suitable or adequate protective and securing materials (e.g., plastic wrap, straps, or bans, etc.); or
 - Any discrepancy in count or concealed damage to articles.
- Shipments moving in straightload equipment such as **containers, flatracks, platforms, or trailers**:
 - Straightload equipment that is loaded and tendered to Young Brothers will be accepted subject to "Shipper's Load and Count" (S/L/C) as notated on the bill of lading.
 - Cargo in the container must evenly loaded. Shipper warrants that at the time of delivery to YB, the contents in/on the straightload equipment are properly packaged and stowed to withstand ocean transit.
 - Young Brothers will not be directly or indirectly responsible for:
 - Damage resulting from improper loading or mixing of articles or discrepancy in count or concealed damage to articles.
 - Spoilage or deterioration of goods when such goods are tendered to YB on a "Shipper's Load and Count" (S/L/C) Bill of Lading in a non-insulated container or van not equipped with refrigeration and/or ventilation apparatus.
 - Shipper must provide Young Brothers with a list of contents showing description of goods, gross weight of goods, and weight of the container, van, flatrack, platform, or trailer.

Young Brothers reserves the right to open and inspect the contents of a shipment, including straightload equipment (e.g., containers, g-vans, flatracks, platforms, or trailers), and so indicate on the bill of lading or booking, as necessary, and resealing the items.
