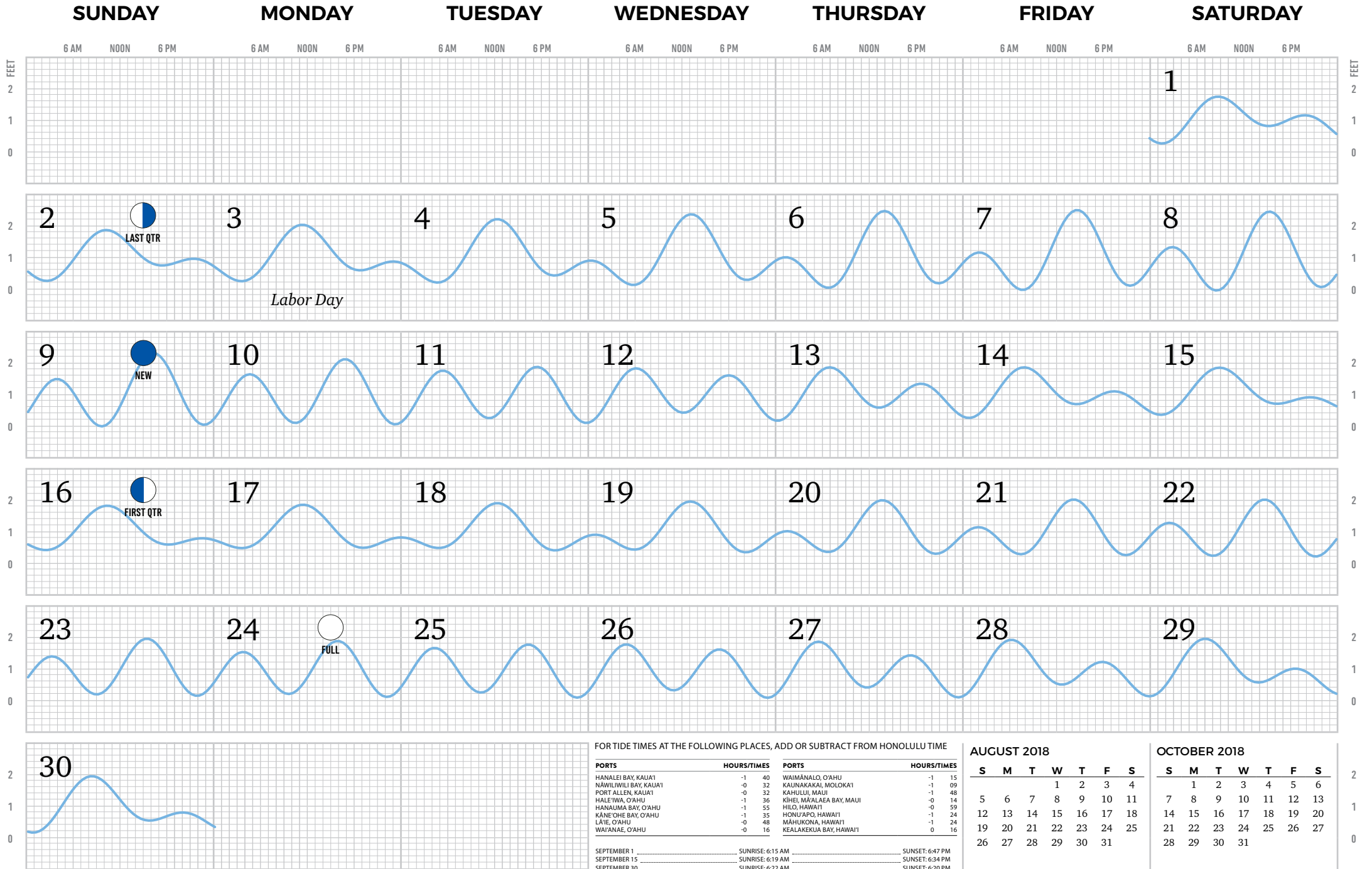


'AU'AU CHANNEL

The 'Au'au Channel is the most shallow and protected channel in the Hawaiian Archipelago. 'Au'au (to bathe) refers to the calm conditions of the channel which often attract Pacific Humpback Whales who migrate to Hawai'i from Alaska and commonly use the 'Au'au Channel as a nursery for their calves. Here, a pleasure craft shuttles eager sightseers in hopes to catch a glimpse of the majestic mammals.
